

Minutes of H.D.C. Special Meeting
Sept. 3 '98

Prior to the official start of the meeting at 8:03 pm. the commission met at the Farreau property on Frye Hill Rd and toured the site, noting 1st hand changes in building plans, addition of deck, problems with grading, addition of shutters, and other smaller details. ~~free~~

Present at the town hall were commission members: Clarence Rabidoux, Peter Kranak, Patience Bundschue, Karen Pickford, ~~George Krawarski~~, Rick Camer, John Poor, and Andy West. Bob Cesignino was again present as an interested H.D. Resident. Randy Farreau was present to address the commission and provide details, and answers. This meeting had been called to specifically accommodate him

as he missed the previous meeting when his attendance had been requested - and then not available.

The purpose of the meeting was stated: ^①to review Farreau construction, note violations and discrepancies - seek answers and ^{and} resolutions to such. ^③Provide missing details for previous unfinished applications. Overall a much necessary confrontation was needed between both parties (H.D.C. + Farreaus) to air problems seek resolution, or take necessary action. Mr Farreau declined to speak at this time.

The building plans were then reviewed. It was noted that no dormer or deck was on the house plans that had been submitted to the H.D.C. It was noted that the B.I. plans did have

these items. Mr Faurau was asked why the B.I. and H.D.C. received different plans. He said "basically he has none" He explained their excitement of building a horse, coupled with other life factors and obligations caused them not to pay attention to the building process.

This was his answer in full.

The commission then proceeded to address each specific issue separately to inform Mr. Faurau what was needed ~~on each~~ to either complete ^{existing} application, or whether a new application was necessary.

① The Grading

It was noted that minimal foundation should be showing - the Building Code requires no more than 8 in of foundation showing. It was explained if Mr. Faurau

④ The subject of a deck application then ~~not~~ came up. John Poor noted that the commission had decided that previous items must be resolved, or applied for before the commission would consider the deck and the dormer.

A heated discussion followed between Mr Poor and Mr. Farreav. John Poor made a statement referring to the deceased builder Don Langlois - which ^{was} in actuality ~~was~~ sympathetic to Mr. Langlois - but the wording was offensive and inflammatory - and -

Mr. Farreav walked out of the meeting. - ~~angry, dissatisfied, and~~

The commission then resumed with

members noting their opinions of what had just occurred.

Patience Bundschue made a strong statement condemning Mr. Poor's words as inflammatory and not representative of the whole commissions approach. She noted with regret and frustration that all of our work at resolution was now for naught and despite our frustration with the Farreas (that Mr. Poor and all members feel) we must work in a conciliatory fashion to come to resolution of the whole affair.

More opinions were expressed and the commission was interrupted by the arrival of Mr. Farreas' ^{wife} mother ~~hat~~ and grandmother - both ^{sister} mother

to Don Langlois the builder - whom Mr. Poor had made the statement about.

They ^{ISL} asked for John Poor and expressed their anger with his remark. The Elder Mrs Langlois then addressed the commission as to why we did not want to have these kids (the Favreas) in our Historic District - she noted her frustrations - and her life long residency of Royalston.

It became apparent that there were many misunderstandings about the commission itself, and the commissions dealings with the Favreas.

Andy West, chairman, stood and took control of a disintegrating meeting. He then patiently and clearly explained to the Langlois women

what the purpose of the commission was, and its adherence to by-laws. He then went through a recounting of the application process with the Farreaus and what the commissions problems and contentions were. ~~He also~~
^{John Poor} explained the context of ~~John~~^{his} Poor's unfortunate characterization of the deceased Don Langlois.

With Mr. West's authoritarian yet patient manner - a dialogue ensued to resolve the problems at hand.

Mr. West walked the Langlois through what had been requested of Mr Farreau earlier in the meeting. Mr. Farreau's mother in law took notes and said she would attend the next meeting with all the necessary applications and

details. It was explained to her that all minor infractions would be addressed before discussion even began on the deck and the dormer. She understood and agreed to this - expressing her hope that a resolution could be ~~be~~ agreed upon that allowed the deck and dormer to remain. The commission remained uncommitted on these topics and continued to maintain resolution of minor problems.

15th. The Langlois left with the commission feeling that progress could again be made.

A long discussion followed - and P.B. stated she had an application to present. Mr. Poor excused himself due to the lateness of the hour and the exhaustion

the meeting had incurred. The other members ~~s~~ remained to peruse Patience B's application.

After an initial look-over no ~~initial~~ voting occurred - and the commission concurred that time and viewing of the maps was necessary to consider the application.
