Moderator George Northrop called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

There were 53 voters present at this Town Meeting. **Moderator George Northrop called the reconvened meeting – June 24, 2011 – to order at 7:06 p.m. 25 voters were present at the reconvene on June 24, 2011

Before action on articles, Moderator Northrop invited Andrew West to speak to the meeting about the "State of the town". Mr West made a presentation regarding the town's financial/budget status, a general outline of continuing and suggested town projects, and a synopsis of the warrant.

Moderator Northrop allowed a motion to take Line Item 9 and Line Item 53 of the budget article (Article 37) out of order, and allow the Superintendents and business managers of Montachusett Reg. Voc. Tech School and Athol-Royalston Regional School District to speak to those school budgets. Motion was made and seconded to vote on the amounts listed in Line Item 53, and then Line Item 9 of Article. Both line items were passed as listed/read.

- Article 1. To choose one or more persons to act for the town in lawsuits, or act anything thereon.

 Moved to choose the Board of Selectmen to act for the town in lawsuits, seconded.

 Passed unanimously
- Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from available funds in the Treasury, any sums of money to meet the appropriations under this warrant, or act anything thereon.

 Moved to approve the article as read, seconded

 Passed unanimously
- Article 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of revenue for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011 and to issue or renew notes as may be given for a period of less than one year, in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44 of the General Laws as amended, or act anything thereon.

Moved to approve the article as read, seconded <u>Passed unanimously</u>

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to fix the salaries and compensation of all elected officers of the Town as provided by Mass. General Laws, Chapter 41, Section 108, or act anything thereon.

Moved to approve the article as read, seconded. Passed unanimously

To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer to pay a sum of money for *total* debt, Article 5. raised and appropriated through debt exclusion, Forty Four Thousand Sixty Five Dollars (\$44,065) for the Royalston Community School, and Ten Thousand Six Hundred Eighty One Dollars (\$10,681) for the Athol-Royalston Middle School, or act anything thereon. Moved to raise and appropriate \$44,065 to pay debt service on the borrowing authorized by the vote of the September 10, 1993 Town Meeting Article 1 for the Royalston Community School and to raise and appropriate \$10,681 to pay debt service for the borrowing authorized by the vote of the May 7, 2004 Town meeting under Article 5 for the Athol-Royalston Middle School Building Project. Motion was seconded.

Passed unanimously.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to move the sum of Eighty nine Thousand Five Hundred Thirty Two Dollars (\$89,532) from Certified Free Cash to the Stabilization Account, or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read – requires a 2/3 vote.

Passed 45-0

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to take all necessary and appropriate action to establish and to maintain, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 164 of the General Laws and in accordance with the rules, regulations and orders of the Department of Public Utilities and the Department of Telecommunications & Cable, a municipal lighting plant for all purposes allowable under the laws of the Commonwealth, including, without limitation, the operation of a telecommunications system and any related services, or act anything thereon.

> Moderator Northrop indicated that based on the advice of Town Counsel and Selectmen, this was an article that required a paper ballot vote. Moved the article as read, seconded. Discussion, then the Moderator called for collection of paper ballots. Ballots counted by two registered voters as directed by the Moderator. The result of counting was: 47 in favor, 3 opposed, 1 blank. **Passed 47-3.**

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Health Agent Revolving Account to be expended for the administration and enforcement of Title V and other health regulations; that departmental receipts from persons making application for septic installation and other Board of Health permits be credited to said fund; that the Board of Health be authorized to spend monies in the Fund, and that the limit on the total amount spent from the account for the ensuing year shall be Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded

Passed unanimously

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Plumbing Inspector Revolving Account to be expended for the purpose of paying an inspector; that department receipts from fees charged to persons installing plumbing be credited to said account, that the Plumbing Inspector be authorized to spend monies in the account, and that the limit on the total amount spent from

the account for the ensuing year shall be Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000); or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded Passed unanimously

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Wiring Inspector Revolving Account to be expended for the purpose of paying an inspector; that department receipts charged to persons who are installing wiring be credited to said account, that the wiring inspector be authorized to spend monies in the account, and that the limit on the total amount spent from the account for the ensuing year shall be Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000), or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded Passed unanimously

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a Post Office Revolving account to be expended for the administration and operation of the Postal Contract; departmental receipts to be credited to said fund; that the Post Office Manager be authorized to spend monies in the fund, and that the limit on the total amount spent from the account for the ensuing year shall be Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500), or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded Passed unanimously

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer to pay the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for engineering, plans, and authorized roadwork up to the reimbursable amount according to the provisions of Chapter 90 Massachusetts General Laws and/or STRAP grant, and the same to be spent with the approval of the Board of Selectmen and Massachusetts Highway Department, or act anything thereon.

Moved that the article read \$600,000, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, a sum of money to demolish 1 School Street, or act anything thereon.

Moved to table the article, seconded. Required a 2/3 vote.

Article Tabled 31 in favor, 2 against.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) to be used for planning, events, and fundraising related to the 250th Anniversary of the incorporation of the Town to be held in 2015, or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded.

Passed

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to clean up the site of 2 King Street, to include grading and reseeding of the property, or act anything thereon.

Moved to table the article, seconded. Required 2/3 vote.

Article Tabled, 33 in favor, 4 against

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) for tree removal in cemeteries, or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as raise and appropriate \$2,500, seconded. Motion to table, seconded.

Motion to table was defeated.

Passed. (2 opposed)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) to provide police patrols of the Tully Dam area, to be reimbursed by the Corps of Engineers, or take any action thereon.

Moved to take from Stablilzation the sum of \$4,000 to provide police patrols of the Tully Dam area, to be reimbursed by the Corps of Engineers. Seconded. Required 2/3 vote

Passed unanimously

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for preservation of cemetery records, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for preservation of cemetery records, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of General Laws Chapter 44, Section 53F-1/2 and establish a Sewer Enterprise Fund for the operation of the Town's Wastewater Treatment Plant and Sewer System, to be managed by the Sewer Commission; said Fund to be effective beginning Fiscal Year 2012, or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded. Motion to table, seconded. Required 2/3 vote Article Tabled 30 in favor, 11 against.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds, a sum of money to operate the Sewer Enterprise, or act anything thereon.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of One Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$1,300) for capital expenditures for the sewer system, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate \$1,300 for capital expenditures for the sewer system. Seconded.

Passed, with 1 opposed

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) to pay for draining and inspection of the aeration tanks at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, or act anything thereon.

Moved to table, seconded. Required 2/3 vote.

Article Tabled unanimously.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to pay for refurbishment, rebuilding or replacement of a pump in the Pump Station, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate \$5,000 to pay for refurbishment, rebuilding or replacement of a pump in the Pump Station, seconded.

Passed, with 3 opposed

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the amount of Forty Thousand One Hundred Fifty Three Dollars (\$40,153) to operate the Wastewater Treatment Plant and Sewer System, the amount to be raised from User Fees, or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to expend Community Preservation funds to preserve two portraits in the P.S. Newton Library. The portraits are of Joseph Estabrooks and Ruth Green Estabrooks. The amount requested, Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900) from the Historic Resource Reserve and Three Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$3,100) from the Budget Reserve, has been approved by the Community Preservation Committee, is limited to Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000), or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded.

Passed with one opposed.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to expend Community Preservation funds to assist the Cemetery Commission in restoring the fence at the Hillside Cemetery. Funds to be sourced in the following manner: Nine Hundred (\$900) drawn from the Historic Resource Reserve and Six Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$6,600) drawn from the Budget Reserve, the total not to exceed Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500) as approved by the Community Preservation Committee, or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as read, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to have an audit completed, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to have an audit completed, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000) for the capital purchase of grounds maintenance equipment, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate the sum of \$18,000 for the capital purchase of grounds maintenance equipment, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) for the first yearly payment of a four-year lease/purchase for a SUV for the Police Department. The remaining yearly portion of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500) to be paid with grant/police association funds. Also to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into a four-year contract for such purpose, or act anything thereon.

Moved the article as raise and appropriate, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to purchase two sets of Structural Firefighting Entry Gear, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to purchase two sets of Structural Firefighting Entry Gear, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) for a hydrant assist valve for the Fire Department, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for a hydrant assist valve for the Fire Department, seconded.

Passed unanimously

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) for a Turbo Draft Fire Eductor for the Fire Department, or act anything thereon.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) to purchase a used four-wheel drive pick up truck and plow for the Highway Department, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the first yearly payment of a three year lease/purchase for a new 4 wheel drive pick up truck and plow for the Highway Department. Seconded.

Passed with one in opposition

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500) to pave the Town Hall Parking Lot with bituminous concrete after the completion of the septic system installation, or act anything thereon.

Moved to take \$12,500 from the Stabilization account the sum of \$12,500 to pave the Town Hall parking lot with bituminous concrete after the completion of the septic system installation. Seconded. Required 2/3 vote.

Passed with only one in opposition.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or take from available funds, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to install high and low water and high and low temperature alarms in the Wastewater Treatment Facility and the three lift stations associated with the collection system and connect them to a central dialer, or act anything thereon.

Moved to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to install high and low water and high and low temperature alarms in the Wastewater Treatment Facility and the three lift stations associated with the collection system and connect them to a central dialer. Seconded. Passed unanimously
